	Nominations should be sent by the home university using the specific table sent to partners.

<b>Conditions for incoming students</b>	All nominations are accepted, but <b>mobility acceptance will be given by each School/Faculty in accordance with their hosting capacity</b>
	Upon nomination by their home university, students will be given a link for their <b>online application</b>
	Some Schools/Faculties may have <b>limited or specific hosting conditions</b> : >IAE Aix (aix-Marseille Graduate School of Management) will only accept very few students due to highly limited hosting capacity >The Faculty of Medicine and Paramedical Sciences has specific conditions due to training periods and mostly accepts students in their 4th or 5th year. Incoming flows will be limited and a future reform will change the Faculty's courses catalogue
	Students can take courses in <b>maximum 2 departments</b> . <p style="text-align: center;"><b>Language requirements</b></p>	<p><b>Most courses are taught in French.</b> However some departments do offer English-taught courses: <a href="https://dri.univ-amu.fr/en/studying-at-amu/programmes-partially-totally-taught-in-english">https://dri.univ-amu.fr/en/studying-at-amu/programmes-partially-totally-taught-in-english</a></p>
	<p>Candidates are not required to provide an official certificate to attest to their level of knowledge in French. However it is strongly recommended that they apply with a <b>B1 level</b> minimum in French (except for English-taught courses)</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Academic Calendar</b></p>	<p>The academic year at AMU officially <b>starts at the beginning of September and ends at the end of September</b> of the following year (courses and exams end in May / june</p>
	<p><b>Teaching schedules</b> vary from faculty to faculty: <a href="https://www.univ-amu.fr/en/public/university-calendars">https://www.univ-amu.fr/en/public/university-calendars</a>. Courses usually start in September and end in May  <b>Examinations</b> are usually held in winter (December and January) and in late spring (May and June).</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Enrollment in French language courses</b></p>	<p>AMU facilitates the language learning process by offering for students <b>French courses for foreigners to exchange students</b> (free of charge). Further information will be sent to students directly by the International Relations Office after acceptance.</p>
	<p>AMU organizes <b>intensive French language courses</b> before the beginning of the academic year (usually last week of August). These French courses are mixed with cultural activities (<b>Welcome week for International students</b>)</p>
