Enrolment in Italian language courses

Further information will be sent to students directly from Sapienza Language Centre. Later inscriptions to Italian language courses will not be accepted. Please, note that Sapienza University also organizes intensive language courses before the beginning of each semester, to support students in the learning process upon arrival. Intensive courses are strongly recommended to students with a lower level of Italian knowledge.
